## What is Upstream?



The Upstream Fund gives money directly to community-led groups and organizations. Who gets funding is decided by a Community Change Committee this means that the process is BY the community FOR the community. To reduce barriers to applying, the Region hosted 13 Community Collaborative Events with 124 participants. These brought community members together to discuss big ideas and get support on writing their applications Upstream initiatives are focused on harm prevention and getting to the root causes of issues in order to improve community safety and wellbeing

An upstream approach to community funding means that we can combine our efforts with financial and other resources to improve our community from the ground up and to create lasting systemic change

The Upstream Fund is an ongoing annual funding process with 2022 being its inaugural year. Some initiatives will be funded for multiple years, and some just for a short time

Every year funds will open to include new projects and to bring in more community members
