Report Title: Entrepreneurial Grants 2023

1. Recommendation

For direction.

2. Purpose / Issue:

To approve the awarding of the 2023 Economic Development – Entrepreneurial Initiative grant program funds, in alignment with the Region's discretionary grant policy and processes, outlined in report COR-ADM-23-002, dated March 7, 2023.

3. Strategic Plan:

This update aligns with Strategic Objective 1.1, to create a competitive businesssupportive community to help attract, retain and grow employers, talent and investments in Waterloo Region.

4. Report Highlights:

- The Region's 2023 discretionary grant funding budget (COR-ADM-23-002, March 7, 2023) includes \$76,000 to support Economic Development, Entrepreneurial Initiatives.
- The application process opened Thursday March 9, 2023, and closed Thursday March 16, 2023. The grants were publicized on the Region's website, on social media channels, and previous grant applicants were contacted directly via email/phone.
- The Region received seven grant applications totalling \$166,500.
- Of the seven applications, five met the criteria of the program.

5. Background:

The Region of Waterloo offers an annual Economic Development Grant - Entrepreneurial Initiative. The program is designed to support the strategic economic

development priorities laid out in the Council-approved Waterloo Region Economic Development Strategy and the 2019-2023 Strategic Plan:

- to support work that achieves a shared vision for economic prosperity that is locally rooted, internationally competitive and globally recognized,
- to plan and provide services to attract immigrants and keep young talent
- to support organizations and networks that:
 - Promote a diverse and sustainable agricultural system and local food industry;
 - Offer programs and services that foster innovation and entrepreneurship;
 - Assist with regulatory compliance and strengthen producer collaboration networks;
 - Prioritize talent development and retention, and outreach to high schools;
 - Welcome new Canadians and help them start businesses.

These priorities were combined to develop evaluation criteria for the Economic Development Grant – Entrepreneurial Initiatives program.

The 2023 budget includes \$76,000 to support this grant program, however, the funding requested by the five organizations recommended for funding exceeds the total budget by \$62,000. Staff made its recommendation based on the application meeting the criteria, the total number of applications, and the total 2023 Council approved funding envelope.

The following table outlines grant applicants in 2023 and the allocations to the five recommended organizations based on the staff recommended amount within the \$76,000 budget and an allocation based on the full amount requested by the organizations adding \$62,000 to the overall program budget:

The organizations that were not recommended to receive grant funding requested funding for activities that did not align with, or were not eligible, based on the priorities outlined in the 2019-2023 Strategic Plan and Council-approved Waterloo Region Economic Development Strategy regional objectives.

The grants were publicized on the Region's website and social media channels and previous grant applicants were contacted directly by email/phone. In addition, all townships, municipalities, and EDC were notified about the grant applications.

7. Financial Implications:

The approved 2023 Economic Development operating budget includes a provision of \$76,000 for the Entrepreneurial Initiatives discretionary granting stream as approved on March 7, 2023 through staff report COR-ADM-23-002. Should Council wish to approve grant amounts totalling more than the 2023 budget provision for this stream, the additional expenditure will be treated as a variance in 2023 and will be reflected as such in the Region's overall financial position.
