
## **Past to Present:** History of the FRIENDS of Waterloo Region Museums

Waterloo Historical Society (WHS) founded. Early curators of the region's history, first archives, artifact collection and museum.



**Ontario Pioneer Community** Foundation (OPCF) founded. 1956

Agreement for the Grand River Conservation Authority (GRCA) to own village land (60 acres) and OPCF to construct, operate, and maintain Doon

Pioneer Village. **GRCA** and Municipalities

partly share financial responsibility for DPV; OPCF continues to own collection and operate DPV.

The Region sets 1914 representation and changes DPV's name to "Doon Heritage Crossroads".

**New Museum Building** built; site named Waterloo Region Museum and Village renamed Doon Heritage Village



2010

First Agreement between Region of Waterloo and FRIENDS to formalize relationship.

2018

WHS approves Dr. A.E (Dusty) Broome's vision to create a living museum



Doon Pioneer Village's official opening with a barn raising.

1960

Official Opening of the original Museum building.



Region assumes ownership of DPV. The OPCF continues to play a supportive, fundraising, and advisory role.

Foundation's formal name change from OPCF to FRIENDS of Doon Heritage Crossroads.

2012



Foundation's formal name change to FRIENDS of Waterloo Region Museum.
