

Waterloo County was once one of the most densely wooded sections in North America.

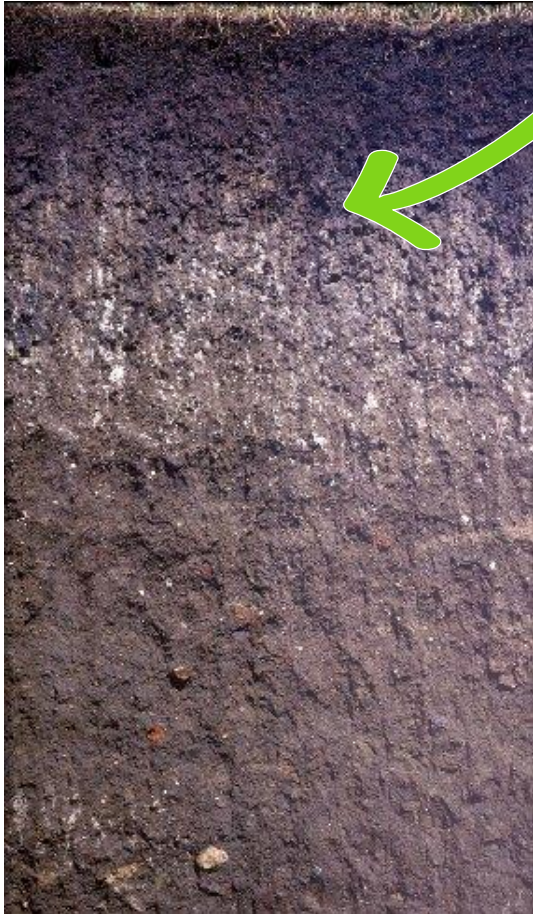
Oak trees three to four feet in diameter, maple, beech, elm, ash oak and great pines were common.
